Coventry High School was recently informed by the Connecticut Coalition for Achievement Now (ConnCAN) that it has been ranked in ConnCAN's Top 10 list for Low-Income Student Performance and Overall Improvement. Coventry High School received a grade of "A-" for the Achievement Gap, which is the average gap between the performance of low-income and minority students and their non low-income and white peers.

In 2011 Coventry High School ranked second in Low-Income Student Performance with 58.5 percent of low-income students scoring at or above goal and sixth in improvement with 12.4 percent change in students scoring at or above goal from 2010 to 2011.

ConnCAN is a New Haven-based, state-wide education advocacy organization dedicated to closing Connecticut's achievement gap. Each year, ConnCAN ranks more than 1,000 Connecticut public schools, and 160 school districts based on their students' academic performance in five categories: Performance Gains, Low-Income Student Performance, African-American Student Performance, Hispanic Student Performance, and Overall School Improvement.
