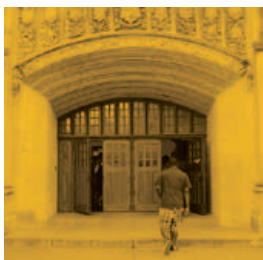

It helps you with college planning.

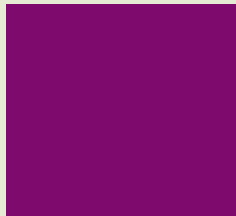
The SAT connects you to free college planning resources, where you can learn more about the application process, access financial aid tools, explore majors and more — all to help you find the right fit.

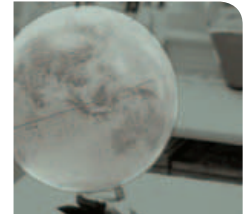
